I hope that you and all of your families had a good half term break. It was great to see all of the children back in school on Monday.

Please remember to follow your Lenten 'Walk with Me' calendar to provide a daily focus for your family during this very special season of the church's year.

Teacher Training Days Next Term:

School will be closed to all pupils on **Monday 8th April** (first day of summer term) and **Monday 3rd June** (first day of summer second half term) for staff training. These are our final inset days for this school year.

Tolerance and Diversity Day – Friday 1st March:

On Friday 1st March there will be an assembly at 9.05am with a guest speaker - Imran Kotwal. He will be talking to parents and pupils to provide an overview of the Islamic faith as part of our British Values and multi-cultural work. Imran will then be leading workshops with all our children throughout the day, enabling our children to understand more about another faith.

World Book Day - Vocabulary Themed Fancy Dress – Thursday 7th March:

Every year we always dress up for World Book Day. Just like last year we would like you to participate in a **'Vocabulary Parade'.**

We would like you to dress up as a word which we don't always hear every day. Here are some tips to help you plan your costume:



Second Sunday of Lent (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 9:2-10

In this Sunday's gospel reading, Jesus goes up a mountain to be alone with his friends, the disciples Peter, James and John. While he was on the mountain, a great change came over him. His clothes became bright and shining white and Elijah and Moses appeared and talked to him. Do you know who they were?

How did Peter, James and John feel when they saw the change that had happened to Jesus? Why were they frightened?



Then a cloud came over and Jesus's friends heard a voice, saying "This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him." Whose voice do you think this was? What do you think Peter, James and John must have felt when they heard God speaking to them from the cloud?

On the mountain the disciples saw Jesus's true loving self shining like the rays of the sun. If we listen to Jesus and spend time with God in our hearts then we too can let our true light shine brightly. For example, we could be kinder to other people, or extra helpful.

You can hear so much more when you really take time to listen. So how do you think we can best listen to what Jesus has to say to us in our lives? Could we, for example, pray more often, or perhaps listen to the gospel stories very carefully?

Our Catholic Mission:

God asks us to be kind and generous to others and treat them as we would like to be treated. Do you think you could listen to God more this Lent? How? What will you do to try and live more as God wants? In Lent we spend extra time praying and we think about how we can help other people, and in this way let our true light shine out from inside us.

Prayer:

God of life, help us to listen to your Son Jesus and to live our lives as he asks us, making a real change to ourselves and the lives of all we meet. Amen.
