SchoolComms App:

Please download the free SchoolComms App to your phone (the details / links are in the circulation email for this week's newsletter) if you have not already done this. By doing this school will not have to pay for text messages to parents when they are used and this will save us quite a lot of money! Thank you for your support.

Parent Consultation Appointments:

This term's parent consultation meetings will be taking place in the school hall on Monday 4th and Wednesday 6th March between 3.30pm and 5.45pm. Our classrooms will be open for you to view your child's work. We will write to all parents with further details, including appointment times, shortly. Please remember that these meetings are for parents and teachers only: there is no provision for children to be supervised at school. We therefore ask you NOT to bring children back into school on these evenings.

Message from Vaccination UK for parents regarding the MMR Vaccination Outbreak Response:

Vaccination UK have been instructed by NHSE to administer the MMR vaccination to all school aged children who are outstanding one or both doses. The MMR would have been given at the age of 1 year and the second dose at 3 years and 4 months. There has been an outbreak of Measles in the West Midlands which have been on the rise within the last few weeks. If your child is outstanding one or both doses of the MMR, please contact their office on 0121 592 1110 to make an appointment. This will be at an alternative venue and NOT at the school.

Extreme Weather:

If the school has to be closed in the event of snow or adverse weather conditions, then parents will be informed via text message and email and a notice will be placed on the homepage of the school website. Unless a text / email is received and an announcement made, the school will remain open.


Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus starts to teach in the temple, where the Jewish people went to pray. The people are surprised and impressed with the way he teaches. Why do you think that is?

The people in the temple believe what Jesus says and they trust him, more than the church teachers they usually listen to. Why did they see Jesus as special?

Jesus teaches the people through the stories he tells. But he also teaches them - and us - through the things he does. He lives out what he is teaching. Can you think of an example when Jesus teaches us through his actions?

What does he want us to learn?



Why do you think it is important for us to go to school and to learn?

Some children who live in poorer countries around the world do not have the chance to go to school. Can you think of reasons why that might be?

Some children live in places where it isn't safe for them to travel to school or the school is too far away. Some children have to do jobs instead of going to school or they have to look after their little brothers and sisters while their mum and dad go to work. Some families cannot afford to pay the school fees or buy the uniforms or books their children need to go to school.

Our Catholic Mission:

Do you think it is fair that children like these do not have the chance to learn?

What do you think can be done to help?
