## Message from Vaccination UK for parents regarding the MMR Vaccination Outbreak Response:

Vaccination UK have been instructed by NHSE to administer the MMR vaccination to all school aged children who are outstanding one or both doses. The MMR would have been given at the age of 1 year and the second dose at 3 years and 4 months. There has been an outbreak of Measles in the West Midlands which have been on the rise within the last few weeks. If your child is outstanding one or both doses of the MMR, please contact their office on 0121 592 1110 to make an appointment. This will be at an alternative venue and NOT at the school.

#### **Parent Consultation Appointments:**

This term's parent consultation meetings will be taking place in the school hall on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March between 3.30pm and 5.45pm. Our classrooms will be open for you to view your child's work. We will write to all parents with further details, including appointment times, shortly. Please remember that these meetings are for parents and teachers only: there is no provision for children to be supervised at school. We therefore ask you NOT to bring children back into school on these evenings.

#### Number Fact of the Week:

It is really important for our pupils to learn their multiplication facts as quickly as possible. By the end of Y4, it is expected that all pupils will be able to instantly recall all of these up to  $12 \times 12$ .

Every week, Mr Shanahan, our maths leader, will be setting a challenge to learn a specific number fact.

Be prepared: when he sees you around school he will be testing you!

This week's number fact is:

$$7 \times 2 = 14$$

or

$$2 \times 7 = 14$$

# Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

**Gospel:** Mark 1:40-45

In this Sunday's gospel a man who has a skin problem comes to Jesus and asks to be healed. Jesus makes the man better but asks that he not tell anyone what has happened. Instead, he asks the man to visit the priest and give thanks to God for his cure.

How do you think this man felt when he realised that Jesus had healed him?



The man does not do as Jesus asks; instead, he goes round telling everyone the story. Why do you think he does this?

Perhaps it was because he was just so happy to be well again and wanted everyone to know about it.

We try to be like Jesus today in our world, by caring for others, and helping them when they are ill or finding things difficult. Can you think of some ways that we can do that?

Last week the gospel taught us about how Jesus healed people. Just as important is helping people to stay healthy. We've all been trying to do our best this year to keep ourselves and others healthy.

There are lots of ways to keep healthy. Eating the right food and making sure we get enough exercise. Washing our hands, especially after going to the toilet and before eating. And, at the moment, by making sure we stay two metres apart.
