Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

Gospel: Matthew 22:1-14

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells us another parable to try and explain what the kingdom of heaven is like.

The king's son is getting married. He invites lots of people to the party but when the day comes and the king sends out his servants to fetch the people they do not come. He tries again, but the people just aren't interested in coming.



How do you think the king feels about this? What does he do next?

The king sends out his servants to stand in the middle of the street and invite everyone they can find to the wedding. So they do, and the wedding hall is filled with guests.

Have you ever been to a wedding? Or another big party or celebration? What was it like? Did you have to do anything beforehand to get ready to go to the wedding/party?

When we go to a wedding, or any party, we tell the person who invited us that we are coming. We get out our best clothes and make sure we are clean and tidy. We buy a present and write the card. Can you think of anything else that we do to get ready for a party?

The king in Jesus' story represents God and the wedding is the kingdom of heaven. What do you think that Jesus was trying to tell us with this story?

We are all invited by God to enter into the kingdom of Heaven. It is a place where everyone is welcome. But we have to be ready to go.

Our Catholic Mission:

How do you think we can answer God's invitation and get ready for the kingdom of heaven? What do you think God asks us to do?

God asks us to be kind, to be welcoming and invite others to share in what we have, to bring peace, to stand up for what is right, to care for and respect one another and to love our neighbour, wherever they are in the world.

How does God want you to live your life? And how will you answer that invitation this week?

Prayer:

God who calls us, strengthen and help us as we try to say yes to your invitation to be with you, by living lives of sharing, kindness, respect and love. Amen.
