



The most shark attacks have been in Australia, South Africa, America and Brazil.

What do they eat?

Some types of shark can be deadly, but only about 12 species have ever attacked humans.

What sharks eat depends on its species and where it is.




Most sharks are meat eaters so they like to eat fish and other sharks. Some larger sharks eat dolphins, sea lions and small whales.

Smaller sharks eat small aquatic life like clams and crabs.

What are they good at?


Sharks can smell a single drop of blood in the water from 400 metres away.

They can hear fish moving from around 500 metres away.

Great white sharks can swim up to 18mph!

Amazing Fact!

Most shark species would die if they stopped moving. As long as they keep swimming, water keeps moving over their gills, which keeps them alive.

Awe and Wonder Plastic Bag Parachutes















Method:


- 1. Cut off across the corners of the square, creating an octagon shape.
- Hole punch in the middle of each side.
- 3. Put a piece of string through each of the 8 holes and tie.
- 4. Gather the 8 pieces of string together and tie to your plastic person.
- 5. Cut out a small circle from the centre of your parachute to let air pass through gently.
- 6. Get up somewhere high, on top of a climbing frame or up some stairs.
- 7. Hold the centre of your parachute, with the person underneath. Let go and watch how they travel to the ground.
- 8. Does the parachute open? Does the person travel fast or slow? Does the person go straight down or to one side? Does it spin? What could you do differently?

The Science Bit


When you release the parachute the weight pulls down on the strings and opens up a large surface area of material that slows down the person. The larger the surface area the more air resistance and the slower the parachute will drop.
