

What Are We Learning?

We are learning number bonds to 5.

How to Set up the Challenge

- Gather a collection of five small items, such as buttons, coins or pom-poms.
- Place the items into a small bag.
- Take turns with your child to take some items out of the bag.
- With your child, count each set of items and then count the total.
- Talk about the number bond. For example, 'I have three buttons and you have two buttons. Three and two make five.'
- Place the items back into the bag and repeat the activity. Try taking different numbers of items and talk about the different ways you find of making five.









Number Bonds Pairs Game

How to Play


- 1. To play number bonds to 5, only use the cards numbered 0-5.

- 5. Continue until all the 'pairs' have been found. The winner is the player with the most pairs.






