YEAR GROUP	Nursery	NO.	1	DATE:	23.03.20
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FOCUS	TASK(S)	GUIDANCE
ENGLISH	<p>Monday and Tuesday Gather 5-6 items from around your house which make a noise. Play a game of guess the sound. Have your child turn around and you use the items to make the sound behind their back. Your child has to identify what item it was from the sound.</p> <p>Wednesday and Thursday Sing 2-3 nursery rhymes with your child each day. Stop at key words and encourage your child to fill in the missing words i.e. "twinkle twinkle little" Below is a link to a range of nursery rhymes just to refresh your memory. Get singing with your child! https://youtu.be/lzc_Rd4TuYg</p> <p>Friday Play a matching game with the cards provided. Can you match two picture cards together that rhyme? For example; "fox and box." Please see below for the matching cards.</p>	<p>Items could include; keys, coins in a jar, rustling a crisp packet, tapping a pan with a spoon etc..</p> <p>Nursery Rhyme ideas; Humpty Dumpty Incy Wincy Spider Wheels on the bus Baa Baa black sheep</p> <p>Encourage your child to listen carefully for the sounds in the words. Try highlighting words that don't rhyme first to emphasis the ones that do.</p>
MATHS	<p>Monday and Tuesday Play with your child with some building bricks or small toys. Work with your child to look for similarities between the toys ie; colour, size etc. Encourage your child to count how many of each colour or size there are.</p> <p>Wednesday and Thursday Set the table for dinner with your child. Count how many knives, forks, spoons, cups plates etc you will need. Count how many things you have got altogether. When you have counted each item show your child what that number looks like by writing it on a sheet of paper.</p> <p>Friday Go in your garden and pretend you are a soldier marching. Count your steps as you march. Stop and start as you march and change direction each time starting back at number 1.</p>	<p>Attempt to count 1-5 first, then 1-10 if your child is confident.</p>

TOPIC	Each night watch the CBeebies bed time story at 6.55pm with your child. At the end of the week ask your child to choose their favourite story and draw a picture of it. Encourage your child to recall what happened in the story. Record what they say underneath their picture as the “child’s voice.”	Your child should use their yellow book to do their drawing. Remember to record what your child says underneath as the “child’s voice.”

Draw a line to join the rhyming words together. You could also cut out the pictures, turn them face down and play a game to find rhyming pairs.



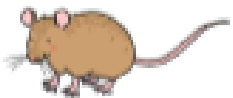
