Holy Name has used this funding to employ a specialist coach from Aspire Sports during the academic year 2017-18.

Schools can choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons
- support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers
- attending sport competitions and increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- providing sports activities alongside other schools

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- 1. the engagement of <u>all</u> pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- 2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport

In 2017-18 at Holy Name, we have focussed on developing key indicator 2 and 3 following self-evaluation of our school's strengths and areas of development.
