## **PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT SPENDING 2015 – 2016**



As part of the Government's policy to improve the educational attainment of under-performing pupils, additional funding has been allocated to schools through the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG.) This allocation (£1300 per qualifying pupil) is based on the number of pupils in Reception to Year 6 who have been entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) as recorded on the termly census. An additional allocation of £300 is made for pupils of service personnel. Children who are Looked After (LAC) receive an allocation of £1900.

This had a very positive impact on their achievement (demonstrated by in-year data.)</li> <li>Booster groups were provided for children in Year 6 and Year 2. 2016 SATs results demonstrate that Holy Name is above the national average for reading, writing and maths for both Key Stage 1 and 2.</li> <li>Private, out-of-school tutoring has been provided for a child to enable them to enhance their reading skills. At the end of 2016, this child made 3 points of progress.</li> </ul>
