Why do we need a home-school agreement?

It serves as a reminder that we will not tolerate any aggressive behaviour towards staff, families or any other visitors to the school premises.

Parents / Carers

We will:

- Support the Catholic ethos and Mission Statement of the school and encourage my child's active participation in the religious life of the school.
- Work in partnership with the staff of the school to enable my child to reach their full potential.
- Ensure that my child attends school regularly and on time, refreshed and ready to work.
- Ensure that family holidays are not taken during term time.
- Ensure that my child wears the correct uniform and brings their P.E. kit when required.
- Inform the school about any concerns or problems which might affect my child's attendance, work or behaviour (and not approach other pupils or parents about any school-based concerns or incidents).
- Support the school's efforts to maintain high standards of behaviour by supporting the school's behaviour policy.
- Encourage my child to have a positive attitude to school work and ensure that homework is completed.
- Encourage my child to read and to listen to them read at home regularly.
- Attend parents' evenings, sacramental meetings and other meetings held to discuss and support my child.
- Act in accordance with the school's <u>social media policy</u> and not use social networking sites or any form of texting or group chat apps to make complaints or complain about any aspect of the school or post malicious or fictitious comments about any member of the school community.
- Never act aggressively (verbally or physically), undermine, intimidate, harass, threaten or abuse any member of the school community including all staff, pupils and parents publically or in private.
